

What is JASS:

The Junior Award Scheme for Schools (JASS) is an accredited award scheme for young people.

Key points:

There are 8 awards:

Each class will aim to complete 1 award per academic year.

Focus:

Each award is broken down into 4 areas/projects:

My Interests: Developing an interest or learning a new skill.

Get Active, Stay Active: Taking part in sport and physical activity.

Me and My World: Contributing to the local community.

Adventure: Outdoor activity and learning, including team work and problem solving



JASS should be programmed for at least one lesson per week.

Evidence:

Each of the 4 areas/projects requires 3 pieces of evidence. Examples could include:

- Annotated photographs
- Evaluations or write ups
- Plans (such as mind maps or designs)
- A poster or letter
